Bern Data Science Initiative launched (November 2021)

The Bern Data Science Initiative, BeDSI, a network at the University of Bern aiming to foster data driven research and promote it across disciplinary and faculty boundaries, was launched in November 2021. Three initiators, Prof. Dr. Christiane Tretter, Prof. Dr. Tobias Hodel, and CAIM Director Prof. Dr. Raphael Sznitman explain why this network is important.

CAIM opens Expert Directory (December 2021)

CAIM is active in networking AI and healthcare experts within the Bern Medical Hub. To facilitate this and additionally aid international collaboration, it has created an Expert Directory where postdoctoral fellows and faculty level members active in AI in medicine research are cordially invited to register. The Directory is online since December 2021 and can be searched for names, data types, methodology or clinical application area, so that experts with a specific skill set can easily be identified and approached.

CAIM funds five translational projects (February 2022)

Twenty teams submitted their projects to the first CAIM Research Projects Fund call. After a peer-reviewed assessment by external reviewers and a pitching round, the CAIM Management and Steering Committee have selected five projects in acute and preventive medicine to be funded with up to CHF 100,000 each over the coming 24 months.
